# Attended Warwickshire Rural Community Council's AGM.

Discussed land on the outside edge of any village boundary, identified by the Parish Council for local need housing, normally known as 'exemption sites'

### **Binley woods**

Met with Highways England and engineers. Discussing flyover. Residents concerned over noise. Noise barriers being discussed.

# Planning services working party – cattle market – Rugby.

Proposals for 4 blocks of flats  $-2 \times 4$  storey  $/2 \times 6$  storey blocks with a provision for open space and footway. The aim of this development is to house commuters. Very little parking provided.

# South West Rugby extension – between M45 / A45 north – S West of Dunchurch.

Provision for 5,000 houses, 35 hectares, 3 schools, and 1 secondary school. Buffer of green space between Bilton / Dunchurch.

### Incl. fire station. Surgery – 3 GPs.

# White Lion Pailton

Bid is being submitted to purchase – on Friday 20<sup>th</sup> September. Money allocated from Public Works Landlord. Sub committee has been set-up to:

- 1) Buy the premises
- 2) Put together a plan to renovate

#### Public Participation Session with regards to items on the agenda. Planning Consultations Ref: R19/1051, R19/1052 – Newnham Paddox House, Newnham Paddox, Monks Kirby, CV23 0RX.

Lord & Lady Denbigh reported that the Highways Agency had objected with their concern being the estate road was single track with no passing places. Possible solutions:

- 1) Install a one-way traffic system, with the traffic emerging onto Brockhurst lane
- 2) Use hardcore on the estate road to put in passing places

English Heritage also objected with concerns over the new house not being large enough.

# Ref. 19/01273/REM (HDC) Plot D Magna Park, Lutterworth.

This land has now been sold to Gazeley.

Central Magna Park North (North of Meer Lane) and South.

The change being sought is for 3 larger units to replace the agree 6 smaller units passed following the outline application. The square footage to remain the same. Taller buildings to be erected to get cubic capacity and will drop the land level to compensate – set in outlying planning permission.

The council queried how much taller the buildings would be and how visible they would be, whilst acknowledging that Magna Park have been very good about screening buildings.

Cllr Woolliscroft said that if the buildings were no higher than existing buildings there would not be a problem – all Councillors agreed.

The Council confirmed they supported this application on the condition that height and screening are sufficient and not intrusive and the changes reflected in the screening have already been agreed in the outlying planning apps.

### Ref. R19/1051 / R19/1052 Paddox, Monks Kirby.

Newnham Paddox House, Newnham

Cncllr. Washington had previously communicated to the council that he supported This application.

Cllrs Wright, Dalby, Payne and Partridge had no objection.

Cllr Woolliscroft expressed an interest in the comments of the Highways Agency and would be keen to reduce traffic so would favour passing places on estate.

Action: Council approved this application. Construction vehicles to use coalpit lane, not Brockhurst lane – put in passing places on estate.

# Ref: R19/0839 28 Brockhurst lane

Amended plans received – building was significantly smaller.

No wording was received regarding not turning this building into housing in the future **Action:** Clerk to reply to this effect. Council agreed to support the application based on this condition.
